Among our assessment activities and preparations were:

We used the MCLL rubrics for evaluating writing samples for each major taking the capstone course, Spanish/French 526. Maria Akrabova, Rose Estill, Melissa Goldstein, Mike McGlynn, Mireya Serna, and Kerry Wilks rated forty-one samples of MCLL majors with a specialization in Spanish, and Marat Sanatullof and Wilson Baldrige rated eight samples in the French specialization.

Alejandra Bonifacino (Spanish) and Dr. Brigitte Roussel (French) gave OPIs to thirty students in Spanish/French 525, a capstone course, including 22 majors.

Rose Estill, Marat Sanatullof, and Yumi Foster served on the PreK-12 Foreign Language Program Committee, which is chaired by Dr. Sanatullof, and includes two professors from the College of Education.

The MCLL Assessment and Curriculum Committee met on 21 August 2009 to discuss various topics, including the upcoming Board of Regents Review.

Assessment Committee Chair Mike McGlynn has begun developing a new student evaluation form designed with the specific needs of language teaching in mind. This on-going project will be addressed in 2010 and 2011.
